It is with a heavy heart that we report the untimely death of Mr M.L. Chatrath of Fareedabad in India.

Not all AIS members may know the name of Mr. Chatrath, but he was instrumental in helping AIS in organizing our first cataract camp in Amroha. He was also helping us to organize others soon.

Mr. Chatrath worked tirelessly to help the poor people of Fareedabad for

Mr. Chatrath was very keen to build an eye hospital in Amroha. A retired Air Force member from Amroha had already agreed to donate two acres of land for it. He used to often say to me, "we will build an eye hospital in Amroha, *insha-allah*, Ikram".

We will miss this dynamic man, but his legacy of selfless contribution and caring



about the needs of those less fortunate will live on in AIS work, as well as in the work of the Chatrath Trust and in all those people whose lives have been improved because of the work of this one man, and his dreams for a better future.

From here to the outer reaches of our cosmos


There is none more precious than an innocent child

Sadequain Foundation

A fundraiser and exhibition of the works of Sadequain was held in San Diego, California on 23 August 2008



The SADEQUAIN Foundation hosted a fundraiser and exhibition of the paintings, calligraphies, drawings, and replicas of murals by Sadequain in San Diego, California on the 23rd of August.

Riffi and Salman Ahmad are the founders and curators of the SADEQUAIN Foundation Gallery, which is dedicated to discovering, preserving, and promoting the art of Sadequain, who was born in Amroha in 1930.

The exhibition was part of ongoing projects to document the life and catalogue the works of Sadequain.

The dinner, presentations, and entertainment took place in the Ahmad's backyard under the stars.



The exhibition attracted a large number of people from all walks of life including local government officials, members of the media and representatives of art organizations and art departments of the local universities who enjoyed a comprehensive presentation on the life and Institute of Geological Sciences, the achievements of Sadequain.

Sadequain was responsible for the renaissance of Islamic Calligraphy in Pakistan. He transformed the art of calligraphy into eye-catching pictorial images that translated the meaning of the script even for those who could not read.

His monumental murals, such as the one displayed above, in excess of thirty-five, represent unparalleled body of artistic endeavor by any artist of the region.



These murals adorn the halls of the State Bank of Pakistan, the Frere Hall Karachi, the Lahore Museum, the Punjab University, the Mangla Dam, the Aligarh Muslim University, the Banaras Hindu University, the Indian Islamic Institute in Delhi, and the Abu Dhabi Power House, to name a few.

To put it in perspective, his paintings and calligraphies in the building of the Islamic Institute in Delhi cover more than seven thousand square feet.

Other actors in the film include Arshad Warsi, who is also directing, Dia Mirza and Bonam Irani.


