#### **EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES**

A major objective of AIS is to provide assistance to our underprivileged students in Amroha.

AIS has thirteen scholarships available for under privileged students who have completed high school or intermediate college and who wish to continue their education but are not able to due to lack of funds.

The criteria for providing support are the following:

- 1. The monthly income of the family of the recipient should not be more than Rs 10,000.
- 2. The student's scores must be more then 60%.
- 3. The student will be able to provide evidence of enrolment in a three to four year program.

We were truly saddened to hear of the passing away of Dr Imam Murtaza and his dear wife from food poisoning in Amroha. He was a dedicated community worker and was the National Secretary of Anjuman Tahaffuz Azadari which gives scholarships to poor Shia students. He was a pious and kind man.
