THE EYE CAMP ON 12 JANUARY 2023

Doctors examined 226 people, 43 had cataract surgery and 142 were examined by the optometrist and given free glasses. More than 80 people were given free medicine for minor eye problems.





We had 350 patients. Of these 57 were taken to the Indira Gandhi Eye Hospital in Gurgaon for cataract surgery.


THE EYE CAMP ON 10 AUGUST 2023


Of those tested by the optometrist 100 were given glasses. Free medicine was provided for those with minor eye problems.
